DO Recycle!




Metal cans (including EMPTY non-hazardous aerosols), glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles and jars, CLEAN aluminum trays.



Newspapers, catalogs, magazines, phone books, soft cover books.



Gray paperboard (tissue boxes, cereal boxes, etc.), junk mail, school and office paper, envelopes



Corrugated cardboard must be less than 3' x 3' and flattened out.

DO NOT Recycle!



Drinking glasses, mugs, dishes, vases, bakeware, window glass, light bulbs



Miscellaneous small metal items



Plastic Bags, paint cans, plastic toys, Rubbermaid style storage containers



Contaminated food containers, pesticide, motor oil, and lubricant containers
