Perils to New Jersey Wildlife (and worldwide)

- "Natural causes" Disease and predation (predators and microbes)
- **Human-caused** direct and indirect
 - Birds bird populations are down by two thirds
 - Bees, Butterflies, Bats, and other pollinators
 - Per the Xerces Society, "more than one quarter (28%) of all North American bumble bees are facing some degree of extinction risk."
 - Deer motor vehicle and agriculture conflicts
 - Geese aviation and open space conflicts
 - Skunks, possums, raccoons, foxes, etc.
 - Increased road kill due to development

Perils to New Jersey Wildlife

(continued)

- *Habitat loss!*
- Toxins in the air, water, and soil
- Increased human populations mean more development and travel – roads, planes, boats, etc.
- Climate change Audubon science finds that two-thirds of North American birds are at risk of extinction from climate change.
- Human ignorance, indifference, and greed

Exploitation and even cruelty





What to Do???

- In the case of sick or injured wildlife, Do Not approach -
- Contact your local Animal Control Officer or,
- In the case of cruelty, contact your local police department for the Humane Law Enforcement Officer (HLEO).
- Contact a wildlife rehabilitator who specializes in the particular species.
