

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF NORTH BRUNSWICK
AUTHORIZING A PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH
CME ASSOCIATES AND MASER CONSULTING PA TO PROVIDE
TRAFFIC ENGINEERING SERVICES**

WHEREAS, the Township of North Brunswick has a need to acquire Traffic Engineering Services for 2022; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2021, the Township Council approved Resolution 278-9.21, authorizing the solicitation of Requests for Proposals (RFP) for said professional services; and

WHEREAS, services were procured in formal manner in accordance with Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1a et seq., under both a fair and open and competitive process to assure that each person and/or firm is provided an equal opportunity to respond to the RFP; and

WHEREAS, on Wednesday, November 10, 2021, the Purchasing Agent received, and the Municipal Clerk witnessed, the receipt of two proposals in response to PRO22024; and

WHEREAS, the Evaluation Committee, designated to review proposals and make a recommendation, has completed the review process and included herein their Evaluation Report; and

WHEREAS, the Evaluation Committee recommends authorizing a contract with the following two firms: CME Associates (3141 Bordentown Avenue, Parlin, New Jersey 08959 and Maser Consulting PA (331 Newman Springs Road Suite 203 Red Bank, NJ 07701) to provide Traffic Engineering Services for calendar year 2022; and

WHEREAS, proposals have been reviewed and the responses submitted by CME Associates and Maser Consulting PA have been determined to be responsive under the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. and any provisions of the revised statutes of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Township of North Brunswick to enter into agreements with CME Associates and Maser Consulting PA to provide Traffic Engineering Services for calendar year 2022; and

WHEREAS, CME Associates and Maser Consulting PA shall be compensated for said services as outlined within the contract rate schedule; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer shall certify and appropriate funds from the budgeted and capital improvement authorizations relating to services rendered.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED on this 3rd day of January, 2022, that the Township Council of the Township of North Brunswick does hereby authorize the Mayor to execute and the Township Clerk to witness agreements with CME Associates and Maser Consulting PA to provide Traffic Engineering Services, as requested by the Township, for calendar year 2022.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED notice of this action shall be published in the Home News & Tribune as required by law within 10 (ten) days after its passage.

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EVALUATION REPORT

2022 TRAFFIC ENGINEERING SERVICES - REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

DECEMBER 21, 2021

The Township of North Brunswick seeks a qualified vendor to provide Traffic Engineering Services for the municipality for 2022. Two (2) proposals were received, demonstrating general experience and meeting the fundamental qualifications of the services required. A three (3) person committee evaluated the proposals comprised of the following individuals:

Michael C. Hritz, Director of Community Development

Eric Chaszar, Director of Public Works

Tom Vigna, Planner

Each committee member assessed their own affiliations and financial interest, as well as the affiliations and financial interests of family members, to ensure that there was no conflict of interest with vendors that provide engineering services. Each member signed a statement attesting to the fact that there was no conflict of interest. The committee agreed to the criteria to be evaluated and the numerical weighting to be assigned to each. The established weighting criterion on a 100-point scale was as follows:

1. Understanding and Prior Experience with the township – 30 points
2. Experience and Qualifications of Individuals – 20 points
3. Overall company history – 30 points
4. Agreement to the Pricing Model – 20 points

The following summarizes the evaluation process undertaken by the Evaluation Committee for “CME,” and “Maser.”

Familiarity with North Brunswick and Specific Experience in North Brunswick Township

The maximum number of points that could be accumulated for this category is 90, as each member on the evaluation committee could assign up to 30 points for this category. CME scored 90 points and Maser scored 80 points, each reflective of their respective familiarity with the township.

Prior Experience of the Individual/Team Assigned to the Project

The maximum number of points that could be accumulated for this category is 60, as each member on the evaluation committee could assign up to 20 points for this category. Maser scored 60 points in this category, followed by CME with 55 points.

Respondent’s Overall Company History and Experience with Similar Services

The maximum number of points that could be accumulated for this category is 90, as each member on the evaluation committee could assign up to 30 points for this category. Maser scored a total of 80 points and CME scored 80 points.

Agreement to the Pricing Model

The maximum number of points that could be accumulated for this category is 60, as each member on the evaluation committee could assign up to 20 points for this category. Maser received a perfect score of 60 for this category and CME earned a score of 55 points.

Evaluation Report Summary/Recommendation for Hiring

CME scored a total of 280 points and Maser scored a total of 280 points. Given their respective expertise and prior service to the township, the Evaluation Committee recommends that both CME Associates and Maser Engineering be retained to provide Traffic Engineering Services in 2022.
