A special meeting of the North Brunswick Township Council was held on Monday, December 11, 2023 at 7:36 pm at the North Brunswick Board of Education Meeting Room at Linwood School, 25 Linwood Place, North Brunswick, Middlesex County, New Jersey.

Mayor Womack opened the public hearing for Resilient Communities Grant.

Township Project Manager, Michael Moriarty spoke on behalf of the Township and explained the grant opportunities with US Department Housing and CDBGDR. Under the program we will be seeking the full 5 million. He mentioned that CME the Township Engineers purposed basin retentions from Berdins Corner to Mile Run. Mr. Moriarty spoke on the grants this is just one grant there are other grants that the Township will be pursuing. Grant writers will be assisting with the grants.

Mr. Hritz explained they are allowed 1 work vehicle.

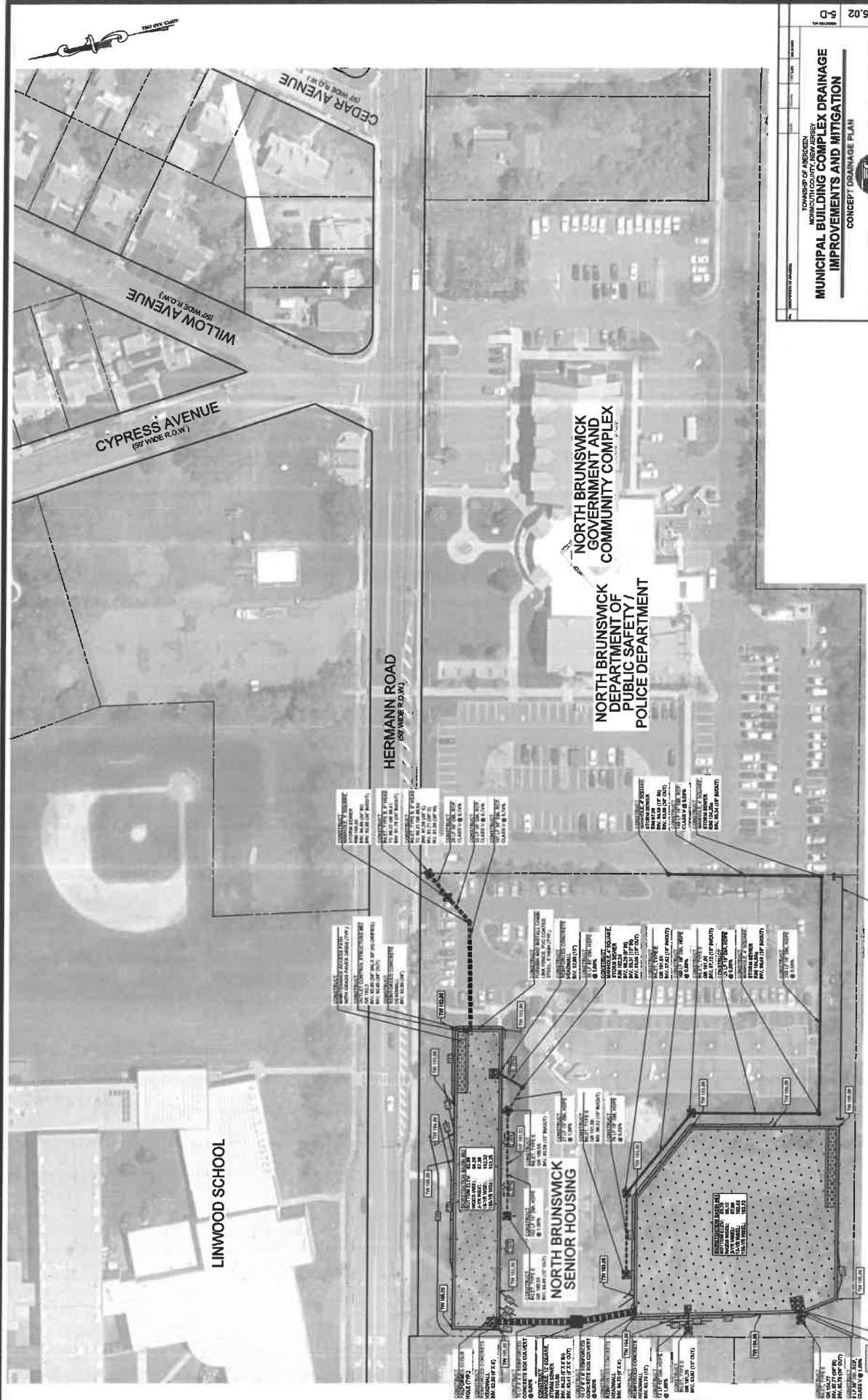
Jennifer Lee, spoke on behalf of the RWJ Nurses and Thanked the Township for Resolution passed.

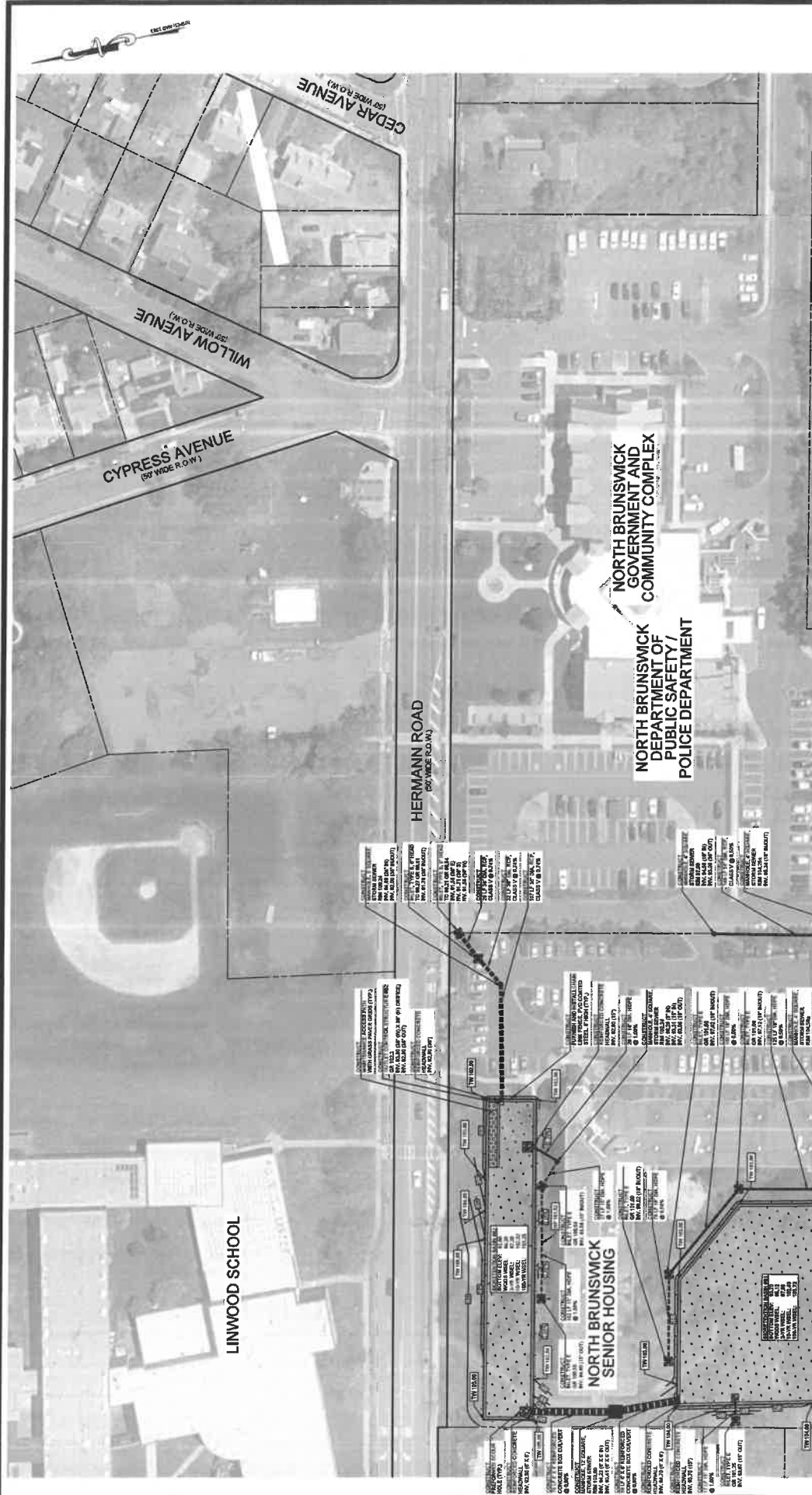

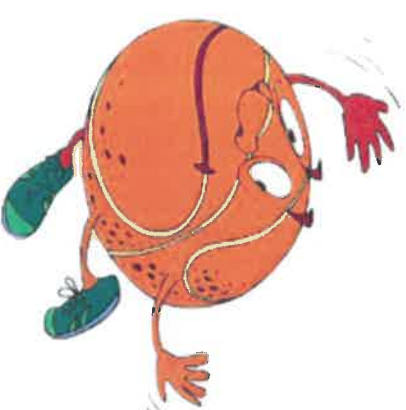
