

**TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BRUNSWICK
ORDINANCE**

Ordinance to Amend Chapter 143, Canvassing and Soliciting, Subsection 143-1, Permit Required, and Subsection 143-2, Application for Permit, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of North Brunswick, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of North Brunswick, Middlesex County, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 143, Canvassing and Soliciting, Subsection 143-2, Application for Permit, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of North Brunswick, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey is amended as follows:

§ 143-1 Permit required.

No person, except as in this Article provided, shall canvass, solicit or call from house to house in the township without having first reported to and received a permit from the Township Clerk.

§ 143-2 Application for Permit.

Before the permit required by the preceding section may be issued, the canvasser or solicitor shall make an application in writing to the Township Clerk, giving the following information: full name and address; age, height and weight; place of birth; fingerprints; length and place of residence; whether or not previously arrested or convicted of a crime; by whom employed and address of employer; a description of the project for which he is canvassing or soliciting.

Each application shall require a fee of \$50. In the event the applicant is a member or representative of an organization which shall have more than one application filed at the same time, each additional application for employees of the same organization submitted shall require a fee of \$25.

Section 2. Each clause, section or subsection of this Ordinance shall be deemed a separate provision to the intent that if any such clause, section or subsection should be declared invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication according to law.
