

*Proclamation*  
*By Mayor and Council - Township of North Brunswick*

**WHEREAS**, the Township of North Brunswick's **Veteran Street Sign Program** allows Township residents who were Wartime Veterans to be recognized by adding their name on a secondary street sign to an existing Municipal Road; and

**WHEREAS**, by adding names of local Wartime Veterans to public street signs, we hope to promote public awareness of these individuals and show our appreciation for their outstanding contributions and service to our country as a member of the United States Armed Forces; and

**WHEREAS**, eligible military candidates for this honor include honorably discharged Veterans having served in Military Departments as defined under Department of Defense which include Departments of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and the Coast Guard; and

**WHEREAS**, Wartime Veterans are individuals who served in the active military forces, during a period of armed conflict or who received the armed forces expeditionary or other campaign service medals during an emergency condition, including those who died in the line of duty in the active military forces; and

**WHEREAS**, **Badawy Badawy** has been selected to be recognized in the Veteran Street Sign Program; and

**WHEREAS**, **Badawy** born on June 22, 1983 in Edison New Jersey to his parents Maged and Mervat Badawy. He moved to North Brunswick in 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, **Badawy** joined the Army Reserves in June of 2001 at the age of seventeen, while he was still in High School. Since he was still a minor, his parents had to sign for him and they were willing to do so since our nation was at a time of peace; and

**WHEREAS**, **Badawy** graduated Basic Training that he attended in Fort Jackson South Carolina in September, 2001. This was just one week prior to the horrific attack on our nation September 11, 2001. He was an active reservist and was pulled out of Rutgers University and deployed to Mosul, Iraq in 2006 as a Sergeant. He served in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Shortly after arriving to Iraq, Badawy was named Assistant Convoy Commander where he led over 100 combat missions in the 13 months of combat deployment; and

**WHEREAS**, **Badawy** earned multiple medals, Bronze Star Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global War On Terrorism Service Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal and Overseas Service Ribbon; and

**WHEREAS**, **Badawy** was sworn in as a Police Officer in 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, **Badawy** has a wonderful family, his wife Bianca and children Liana, Gia, and Olivia Badawy, Father Maged Badawy, Mother Mervat Badawy, Brother Kero Badawy, Sister Christina Badawy, Nephew Christian and Niece Celina. In his free time, Badawy and his wife Bianca, own and operate Bella Bianca Italian Deli located in Milltown New Jersey. They also own and operate GarmaGuard which was featured on Shark Tank. Badawy and Bianca spend a lot of time with their 3 beautiful daughters Liana, Gia, and Olivia Badawy and their very large European Doberman; and
